



OPTION 1: PACT CERTIFICATE = CONSTRUCTION JOB



By completing the Careers in Construction Colorado program in high school, students earn certificates which are recognized by the United States Department of Labor, and can acquire internships, job shadows, and entry level jobs in the construction industry.





OPTION 2: PACT CERTIFICATE = APPRENTICESHIP CREDIT





Students -- multiple career opportunities await you! When you complete your HBI PACT Certificate in school, you will earn credit toward half of Year 1 in the Construction Industry Training Council [CITC] Carpentry, Electrical, Pipefitting, Plumbing, Sheet Metal and Masonry apprenticeship programs [Denver] or Independent Electrical Contractors [IEC] Southern Colorado or IEC Rocky Mountain 4-year electrical apprenticeship [CO/WY].
